HERB Parsley - Flat	<b>Single/Plain</b>	Dark green deeply cut flat leaves. Best flavored variety
HERB Parsley - Curled	<b>Forest Green</b>	Deep green curly leaves on long stems for easy cutting and bunching. Good flavor
HERB Basil	<b>Aroma II</b>	24" Genovese type Italian basil. Fragrant sweet with improved disease resistance
HERB Basil	<b>Genovese/Sweet Ba</b>	18" plant with long harvest season.
HERB Basil	<b>Tulsi Basil</b>	
HERB Basil	<b>Aristotle</b>	24" Genovese-type Italian basil. Fragrant, sweet flavor. Improved disease resistance.
HERB Basil-Thai	<b>Siam Queen</b>	24" Fragrant variety. Great for Thai cuisine, soups and curries.
HERB Epizote	<b>Epazote</b>	<i>Dysphania ambrosioides</i> . Central American herb. Robust and tangy flavor. Similar to garden anise, citrus and creosote
HERB Chamomile	<b>German Chamomile</b>	<i>Matricaria recutita</i> . 18" Annual with small daisy like flowers. Popular in teas
HERB Oregano	<b>Greek Oregano</b>	<i>Origanum vulgare</i> . Perennial. 2ft by 1ft plant with white flowers. Full sun. Self-seeds readily
HERB Sorrel	<b>Blood Veined Sorrel</b>	<i>Rumex sanguineus</i> . Perennial 12in showy foliage. Great in salads. Sun/part shade. Self seeds readily
HERB Thyme	<b>Upright Thyme</b>	<i>Thymus</i> . Perennial. 18 inch plant. Use fresh or dried. Full sun and well drained soil
HERB Chive	<b>Chives (Garlic?)</b>	<i>Allium schoenoprasum</i> . Perennial. Popular herb with mild onion and garlic flavors. Full sun/part shade. Well drained soil
HERB Lemon Savory	<b>Summer Savory</b>	<i>Satureja montana v. citriodora</i> . Perennial. 1-2ft woody shrub with lilac flowers. Strong spicy lemon flavor.

TOMATO-Cherry	<b>Chocolate Cherry</b>	1" port wine round fruit with multifaceted flavor. Super productive.
TOMATO-Cherry	<b>Sungold</b>	1.25" Orange fruity flavor with vigorous vines. Fruits grow 10-15 on grape-like trusses
TOMATO-Cherry	<b>Orange Paruche</b>	1" One of the most flavorful cherry tomatoes. Vigorous producer.
TOMATO-Cherry	<b>Magic Bullet - new</b>	Plum shaped with indigo stripes. Amazing flavor. Very Productive.
TOMATO-Cherry	<b>Supersweet 100s</b>	1-1.5" Red Flavor packed. Very disease resistant
TOMATO-Cherry-Container	<b>Oregon Cherry</b>	1-1.5" Early cherry tomatoes on compact plants. Developed at OSU
TOMATO-Early Container	<b>Santiam</b>	3" fruits on short bushes. Early producer. Developed at OSU
TOMATO-Early	<b>Fourth of July</b>	2" abundant tomatoes. One of the earliest producers that just keep going
TOMATO-Early	<b>Early Girl</b>	2-3" sweet-tart tomato. Abundant producer.
TOMATO-Mid	<b>Legend</b>	4-5" fruits that are nearly seedless. Steady producer that is blight resistant from OSU.
TOMATO-Mid	<b>Fantastic</b>	3-5" bright red tomato with beefsteak flavor. Very productive. Likes to be staked.
TOMATO-Mid	<b>Green Zebra</b>	2" Great for salads, fried green tomatoes and salsas
TOMATO-Large	<b>Brandywine</b>	7" large tomato. Worth the wait for award winning taste and a hint of spice.
TOMATO-Large	<b>Big Beef</b>	10-12 oz. Heavy yielding and big flavor. Great Slicer. Disease resistant.
TOMATO-Large	<b>Berkeley Tie Dye</b>	8-12 oz. Sweet tangy flavor. Dark pink/red with green striping.
TOMATO-Paste	<b>San Marzano</b>	3" Oblong flavorful, few seeds. Great for sauce, canning
TOMATO-Paste	<b>Martino's Roma</b>	2-3 oz pear-shaped Rich flavor. Use for sauce, salsa, paste, canning, salads, fresh eating. Puckered foliage.
TOMATO-Paste-Container	<b>Little Napoli</b>	Compact plant. 1' tall x 2-3' wide. Rich, tangy flavor for sauce or salad. Great in a container

What Kind	Name	Description
PEPPER	<b>King of the North</b>	Green to red 3-4 lobed fruit adapted to colder climates
PEPPER	<b>Jolene's Red Italian</b>	8-12" conical, thick-walled fruit. Heavy producer than may need caging.
PEPPER	<b>Orange Sweetie</b>	2-3" snacking pepper. Juicy, crisp and sweet with few seeds
PEPPER	<b>Ancho/Pablano</b>	Flavorful with mild spice. Great for chile relleno or mole.
PEPPER	<b>Serrano</b>	Productive plants with 2" slender, dark green peppers.
PEPPER	<b>Shishito</b>	4" thin-walled Japanese and Korean favorite. Eaten whole and green.
PEPPER	<b>Jalapeno Early</b>	2-3" long fruits green ripens to red on 2' tall plants. Thick walled fruit sets early
PEPPER	<b>Mild Thing - new</b>	2" long fruits with habenero flavor without the overwhelming heat. Developed at OSU
What Kind	Name	Description
CUCUMBER - slicer	<b>Itachi</b>	Unique white Asian cucumbers. 9" sweet and crisp with few seeds.
CUCUMBER - slicer	<b>Summer Dance</b>	9" smooth uniform fruits, crisp clean flavor. High yielding plants. Heat tolerant. Good disease resistance
CUCUMBER - slicer	<b>Market More 76</b>	8-9" slender dark green fruit. Never bitter. Long harvest. Stand up to hot weather.
CUCUMBER - snacker	<b>Lunchbox Snacker</b>	Thin skinned mini cucumbers that are perfect for snacking.
CUCUMBER - pickling	<b>Morden Early Picklin</b>	An early and productive pickling cucumber that grows on short vines. Harvest at 4-5"
CUCUMBER - Special	<b>Lemon</b>	Lemon shaped cucumbers with yellow skin. Mild and sweet. Harvest when the size of limes.
What Kind	Name	Description
SQUASH - Winter	<b>Table Queen</b>	2-3 lb dark green fruits. Yellow, dry, sweet-meat. Keeps well.
SQUASH - Winter	<b>Early Butternut Rem</b>	Developed in Oregon with short summers in mind. 2-4 lb fruits on vines.
SQUASH - Winter	<b>Bush Delicata</b>	1-2 lb creamy white with green stripes, oblong fruit. Tidy bush 4-6' spread. Powder mildew tolerant.
SQUASH - Winter	<b>Sunshine</b>	3-4 lb bright red-orange squash. Great roasted and in soups.
SQUASH - Zucchini	<b>Mutabile</b>	Deep green zucchini that produces all season. Powdery mildew resistant.
SQUASH - Zucchini	<b>Goldini 2</b>	Yellow zucchini that can be eaten small but best when 1-2lbs. Developed in Corvallis by Carol Deppe.
SQUASH - Summer	<b>Costata Romanesco</b>	Fruit are long and slender with attractive ribbing. Vining growth habit.

Eggplant	<b>Ping-Tung Long Egg</b>	10" Slender eggplants with mild flavor. Productive variety.
TOMATILLO	<b>Purple De Milpa</b>	1-2oz fruit with sharp, intense flavor. 3ft sprawling plants.
TOMATILLO	<b>Miltomate</b>	1 inch green fruits on sprawling bush. From Mexico
